



HISTORY OF THE CREED

The Jr. Chamber (or Jaycees) is the Best Young Persons Organization in the World. This is an introduction to the Jaycees, and their Creed. The Jaycees is a great way to meet new people, and network, not only in your community, but with people around the world. The Jr. Chamber is an International Worldwide Community made up of nearly 200,000 young and active leaders. We all share the same beliefs and purpose. We are all young people the ages 18-40. Members of the Jr. Chamber create positive change in themselves and in their community. The Jr. Chamber's goal is to be the Leading Global Network of Young Active Citizens.

The Jaycees started in 1915 in St. Louis, MO as a Young Men's Progressive Civic Association. In 1920 the US Jr. Chamber was established. In 1944 the Jr. Chamber International was established in Mexico City. In 1946 the Jr. Chamber Creed was written by Brownfield, it was adopted by the Jr. Chamber International in 1947. In 1984 Women were admitted into the US Jr. Chamber, when the St. Paul Jaycees brought the Jr. Chamber to the Supreme Court (Thank you past member of the St. Paul Jaycees for seeing an opportunity for me to lead in my community).

The Jaycees started with a dream. 100 years ago, in the city of St. Louis, MO, a young man named Henry Geissenbier had a dream that through community involvement young people could take their destiny into their own hands. It was nearly an impossible dream. Many people did not believe him, but he never stopped believing. Today the Jaycees is still around changing the world. Geissenbier believed a..." great purpose of fellowship, advancement and everything which would make a good boy, a good student a more proficient scholar and a good citizen a better citizen..."

Another great leader, C. William Brownfield later wrote the Jaycees Creed. Brownfield was born March 7, 1919 in Alliance, OH. Brownfield was one of seven children. He grew up with love and passion. He and his family loved the community. He loved giving back, and was often volunteering at church, with youth groups, he was always helping lost or hurt animals back to health. He wanted to be a leader in his church, but because of asthma and health issues, he was not allowed to be a pastor. He was a natural born leader, and founded a coal mining business. In 1943 Brownfield moved to Columbus, OH for greater business opportunities. As soon as he moved, he joined the Jaycees to meet some friends. Right away he loved the organization. He found his passion and wanted to do everything to create positive change. With his passion he became the Ohio Jaycees State President, and a National Jaycees VP of the United

States Jaycees. It was while he was at a convention in 1946 that Brownfield noticed that they did not have a Creed. This really bothered him. How could an organization not have something to stand behind? Brownfield was inspired to write a Creed for the Members of the Jr. Chamber. He worked tirelessly on getting the creed to be what it is today. He was driven by the devotion of the Jr. Chamber members, but how could he express that? He saw the Jaycees as "the potential for a new force in the world".

He knew he had a lot on his plate, how was he going to get people to believe in him? How was he going to show why we do what we do? He wrote the Creed in the backseat of his car.

The Jr. Chamber Creed.

We Believe:

That faith in God gives meaning and purpose to human life;

That the brotherhood of man transcends the sovereignty of nations;

That economic justice can best be won by free men through free enterprise;

That government should be of laws rather than of men;

That earth's great treasure lies in human personality;

And that service to humanity is the best work of life.

The Creed is a statement of our values, what we believe and hold true as an organization. The Creed inspires many people still today as to why they do what they do.

A breakdown of the Jr. Chamber Creed.

That Faith In God Gives Meaning And Propose To Human Life.

Brownfield said: "Every member is free to interpret the Creed in the light of their own conscience." The Jr. Chamber are drawn from many members around the globe. These members come from many different religions and backgrounds. Part of the reason that the Creed took so long to finish was this line. Brownfield was constantly rejecting the idea of adding a line about God. We are not a sectarian organization, but an organization of all men and women, and their beliefs. Brownfield knew that without a greater purpose, our lives are meaningless. It is faith in God that gives meaning and purpose to life.

That Brotherhood Of Man Transcends the Sovereignty of Nations.

This line talks about war and peace. It breaks down the boundaries that have been imagined and drawn in the sand by mankind.

It shows that all men and women are equal. It respects the allegiance to one's country, but at the same time shows the idea that man is a citizen of the whole world. Sovereignty belongs to the people and it should be allocated by them among the political division of the city, the state, and the nation, and internationally Through Junior Chamber International, we can make this belief a reality.

That Economic Justice Can Best Be Won By Free Men through Free Enterprise.

The Junior Chamber could not exist without free enterprise. We should stand upon the faith in the virtue of ambition and initiative and declare our conviction that this system, by which America became great, can bring economic justice to all.

Jaycees believe the best way to nurture and support the rights of all citizens is within the framework of checks and balances known as the free enterprise system. Brownfield said: "Where economic improvement has been greatest, man has been free to follow his dream of making a personal fortune by doing something never done before, or by doing it better.

It is important to remember it says"...can best be won...." Junior Chamber members believe that man should be free to use his skills and abilities to the limit in improving his economy.

That Government Should Be Of Laws Rather Than Of Men.

It is a historical fact that tyranny goes hand in hand with concentrated power. We state our belief in constitutional government in which the body of the law represents the will of the people through their elected representatives. This tenet of the Creed simply means that no one should be above the law, and the law should be the same for all people. The power to change laws and elect governments should remain in the hands of a majority of the people. The government must rest on a foundation of constitutional Law. When the government does not rest on such foundation, tyranny will flourish and people will be manipulated by those in power.

Abraham Lincoln, the 16th President of the United States, spoke of a government "of the people, for the people, and by the people." This line of the Creed crystallizes what President Lincoln was talking about. Brownfield expressed the meaning this way: "In a free society, the fundamental law is derived from the people. It is they who hold the final authority."

That Earth's Great Treasure Lies in Human Personality.

This line declares our belief in human life as being the most valuable thing on earth Every individual has a separate and unique personality. That is the main difference between humans and other creatures of the world. That uniqueness makes the human personality earth's greatest treasure. It cannot be duplicated nor can it be made. Brownfield's said:

"True treasure lies in the hearts of men. There is about us a vast field of opportunity for cultivation of the human personality. It's not the quantity nor the length of life that gives it zest, but the quality of living, the achievement we make in terms of human progress."

And That Service to Humanity Is The Best Work Of Life.

Why do Jaycees give so much of themselves? Because they believe that giving of themselves to serve is important to them: to make their lives of lasting value. We live through our deeds. A person who believes in the Creed will most definitely find service to humanity to be the best work of life.

Note the word "humanity." Brownfield's interpretation of this line of the Creed is: "The life lived unselfishly grows richer, deeper and fuller. Joy is more enduring and peace of mind, more certain. The world looks at the contribution such a life has made and marks the one who lived it as a benefactor of the race; yet he knows in truth the greater benefit has been his own."

No matter what a member's interpretation of the Creed may be, he or she should always practice what he or she believes. Many unsuccessful attempts have been made to change the Creed, but it has prevailed through the years and continues to be the covenant that holds the organization together. Many members have made the Creed their guide in life. The Jaycees Creed still is an important part of why we do what we do. The original Creed is sealed in a glass case for protection, is hung in the JCI office for display in St. Louis, Mo.

FROM THE MINNESOTA STATE JAYCEES

The Minnesota Jaycees **Statesman Organization**

The Statesman Organization is a program that helps local chapters recognize the outstanding efforts of their Jaycee member's extraordinary dedication to the Jaycees. This award is the highest award given by the Minnesota Jaycees. The original "Founders" of this program were MN Jaycees President Jim Jurek and MN Jaycee EVP Randy C. Hemstad. During 1978 the MN Jaycees State President, Jim Jurek wanted a program that would offer a means for the MN Jaycees to honor their best with a State Award. He was looking for an award similar to the US Jaycees Ambassador Program, or the Jaycee Senators International Program. Part of his original goal was to create a program to gain funds to put towards a MN Jaycees Headquarters Building. To see this through, he and his Executive Vice President, Randy C. Hemstad took his original idea and developed the program that has been in existence for over 30 years. Hemstad was the leading force behind the organization, he started and led the Statesman Organization for the first three years.

As an organization the MN Jaycees Statesman strive to work directly with their local Jaycees chapters. Since they started the organization, they have presented the award to over 1500 outstanding members. Members of the South St. Paul Jaycees with that have been honored with a Statesman Award are: Heather Heim, Cassi Johnson, Annie Regan, and Josh Regan. The MN Jaycees Statesman Organization supports the MN Jaycees Write Up and Speak Up Competitions.


Minnesota Jaycees **Foundation**

This test shows new parents if their parents have genetic disorders like PKU and Galactosemia. Rollin is still helping to make positive change in his community, and is one of the South St. Paul Jaycees biggest supporters.
