

## Letter from the President

Dear Fellow Jaycees,

As we head into the second quarter, I would like to share the store of the elephant rope to remind us that we can achieve anything.

A gentleman was walking through an elephant camp and noticed the elephants weren't being kept in cages or held by chains. All that was holding them back from escaping the camp was a small piece of rope tied to one of their legs.

Curious and wanting to know the answer, he asked a trainer nearby why the elephants were just standing there and didn't try to escape. The trainer replied:

#### Foundation

Henry Giessenbier founded the Jaycees in 1920 with 3,000 members in St. Louis, Missouri. It was Henry's vision to provide young people with opportunities which they had little or no access to otherwise. He believed that young people could change the world. He was right.

In his era, most young men were out of school and working by the age of 15. Their first jobs were most likely the jobs they held throughout their lives. With luck and hard work, some might reach executive positions by their forties.

Giessenbier felt that young men were not receiving the opportunities necessary to develop their skills at a younger age, thus depriving our nation of an important resource, and so he formed the founding ideals of the U.S. Junior Chamber.

His theory was simple – offer leadership opportunities to young people, giving them hands-on experience through serving the community. That concept has never wavered.

# How the Jaycee Experience Impacted My Life

I grew up as a Jaycee kid and always wanted to be THAT adult: hosting parties for friends, putting on stage shows to raise funds, traveling around the state, going to parades. I watched my folks work on the backside of events to make them happen. Their friends were all Jaycees and they made me feel like part of the great society. So when we reached the age of empowerment and the Jaycees in town were re-chartered I pushed my husband to join. I could help on the sidelines and have a good time, but when women were finally allowed to join, I was one of the first in line. And I never looked back. It was the perfect time frame for our chapter, our town.



One of the first events we held was a 50<sup>th</sup> anniversary of our chapter. We invited all of the past members, the notables of town, the movers and shakers who had all been Jaycees in their former lives. People like Governor Harold Stassen, US Senator Dave Durenberger, State Representative Tom Pugh. Bank presidents and business owners and 30 some eager young adults ready to tackle the world and improve their lot. This event gave us contacts and put the town on notice that we were here and ready to work.

Our events ranged from selling chili at the town rodeo to selling Christmas coloring books at the Lions pancake breakfast. We helped the postmen get out the word about neighbor awareness and carried canned goods for Neighbors Inc, a local food shelf, as they moved from their cramped quarters into a larger space. We ran one of the first Haunted Houses in the metro area (a blast!) and took on the world champion booya cooks with a first-place finish! We marched in the parades and lit the city fireworks. We hosted Pictionary tournaments and dances with a live band for the adults with special needs. We had a former Jaycee as editor of the local newspaper and lots of coverage.

To compare benefits, I took SSP Leadership classes. This led to being appointed to the Centennial Commission, taking on Service Unit manager for the SSP Girl Scouts and chairing a city task force for river development. These opportunities led to other projects and events. And through it all, I fell back on what I learned from Jaycees. How to make a budget, how to use a chairman's planning guide, the format of which I still use today, and how to make friends and how to have fun. "Service to society IS the best work of life", a mantra I still use.

But it is more than a few skills picked up along the way. Jaycees give young adults, (those under 40) a platform. It gives you a base that others know and understand. A base that is strong, people who are willing to serve others, an opening to a better place. It was where I found my core, the importance of why I must be involved, why I want to make a difference. And I continue to this day, helping the South St Paul chapter whenever or however I can, but especially the next generation of Jaycees, Joe & Audrey Regan as they grow up wanting to fill the Jaycee shoes.




